YOU know what's best for your child; WE can help you make it happen.

If we did not provide a means for ALL families to afford Roncalli Catholic Schools, we could not fulfill our mission. We are not a "prep" school for the wealthy; we are Catholic in the most universal sense. The Roncalli community, demographically and economically, faithfully reflects our Lakeshore community.

Wisconsin School Choice Programs

School Choice programs expand your options. At the current program income levels, about 50 percent of families in our area qualify for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP), which pays a student's entire tuition. The Special Needs Scholarship Program serves students with Individualized Education Plans, regardless of their families' economic resources. The benefits of School Choice reach beyond program participants. Our flexible tuition support goes further for families who do not qualify for the Choice programs. More parents can choose the best schools for their children without worrying about tuition costs. School Choice programs are open to everyone, regardless of citizenship, because our community is stronger when all our children are well educated.

Flexible Tuition

We do not ask any family to pay the full cost of education. Our maximum tuition levels are already reduced by parish investments, fundraising revenue and other generous donations. FACTS Tuition Management helps our families navigate through their tuition options, from paying the maximum amount, through flexible tuition options, to participation in the WPCP. Lakeshore families are making difficult choices about how they spend their hard-earned dollars and every family's circumstances are different. We assist families who are experiencing under-employment, unemployment, illness, death, divorce and disability. The Meitler Study, an independent study of diocesan schools, recently confirmed that Roncalli Catholic Schools excels at making a Catholic education accessible to everyone.



After-school care is offered from 3:15 until 6 p.m.



RONCALLI MIDDLE SCHOOL Grades 5th - 8th

The emphasis of Roncalli Middle School is to develop strong fundamentals and prepare students for the rigors of high school.

STREAM

Roncalli Middle School has implemented a schoolwide initiative known as STREAM (science, technology, religion, engineering, arts and math). As follows is more about the focus of each core subject within STREAM:

Science: Provide topics to create a sciencerelated theme or topic of discussion.

<u>Technology</u>: Use technology to communicate results, data, analysis and/or for documentation of information.

Religion: Infuse religion across all subjects by finding a correlation between the topic/unit of discussion and our faith.

Engineering: Create, build and/or design a product.

Art: Provide students with creative thinking skills. Band, chorus and art offer an array of options to earn fine arts credits.

Math: Incorporate math concepts and skills in the learning process.

Technology

All Roncalli Middle School students are issued a Chromebook for the school year.

Mass

Students are actively involved in weekly school Masses, giving them a dynamic experience in their faith. Prayer is a part of each day. Once a year, each class also attends a retreat to deepen their connection to God.

School Schedule

Roncalli utilizes the A/B Block Schedule. Students take eight classes per semester, but only attend four classes per day. Alternating days allow students extra time between class sessions to plan homework, get extra help, or be free to participate more fully in extracurricular activities. The longer class periods allow for more one-on-one instruction and help us to bring out the best in each student. Roncalli also features Jet Block, which meets daily, and allows students to complete their homework in a timely manner and receive individualized assistance from their teachers.

Statistics of Note

- More than 85 percent of our students voluntarily offer service through our Lasallian Youth Service Club. Each year, they participate in more than 50 service projects giving thousands of hours of service to our community.
- Student involvement is the key to our successful extracurricular activities. More than 90 percent of the students actively participate in after-school programs.
- Transportation services are available to students from Algoma, Kewaunee, Chilton, Brillion, Kiel, Sheboygan and outlying areas.
- The last five graduating classes have earned almost \$8 million in scholarships to universities, colleges and technical colleges.
- Roncalli students have been awarded five Kohl Scholarships in the past five years. This total is among the top 10 in the entire state of Wisconsin!

Personalized Education

Roncalli acknowledges the unique personality and learning style of each student. Quality options for students of various academic levels are offered. Our challenging college-preparatory curriculum has enabled students to attend and succeed at many of the nation's most prestigious universities. Advanced Placement classes and dual-enrollment courses are available through St. Norbert College and the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. Students who benefit from guided instruction utilize the Academic Resource Center. Our Learning Needs Teacher works with both students and instructional staff to ensure success in the classroom. Programs are tailored to meet the needs of the individual student.

VIP Days

Any student who wishes to "try Roncalli on for size" may join us for a school day. With two or three student guides, students will visit classes, join RHS students for lunch, and get to see firsthand what life at Roncalli High School is really like! Career Internship

This is a popular offering for our seniors. They are able to shadow someone for a semester in an occupation of interest such as medicine, education, business, computer science, mechanics, etc. The internship program gives students a small sampling of what takes place in a specific career.

Youth Apprenticeship

This is a county-wide program available to juniors and seniors. Students are given up to three blocks to work at their Youth Apprenticeship site. Applications are required and the businesses select the student they want to hire. Four hundred fifty hours of work are required along with classroom instruction that could be at Roncalli, another high school, Lakeshore Technical College or online option. This program gives students an advantage in their career field when they enter college or the workforce.

Technology

Roncalli High School is preparing students for college and the workforce by offering up-to-date computer resources to complement the curriculum. Roncalli High School provides the following to students: free Internet access, email accounts and Chromebooks (if requested). Roncalli also offers technology courses that students may choose as an elective. One of our courses is Introduction to Computer Science and a new course is AP Computer Science Principles where we continue our partnership with the TEALS program. Students learn programming languages and work hand in hand with professionals from around the Midwest who work as programmers in their career.

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math)

Roncalli has always taken pride in giving students a very strong background in science and math, the two cornerstones of STEM. Through the use of data collection probes, one-to-one computer devices, AP courses, our freshman science program, and several project-based assessments, we have always embraced the STEM philosophy. In response to the increased interest in engineering and technology of our students, we at Roncalli have expanded our STEM offerings to include an engineering sequence of courses. These courses have allowed us to blend different educational disciplines within a single program. The required freshman course "Introduction to Engineering" focuses on communication through writing directions and technical research papers, creating and giving a presentation on that research topic, and learning basic drafting and measuring skills. The course ends with two culminating projects – a balsa wood bridge and basic electricity project. These require the students to use the skills they have learned including wiring, working electrical lights, drafting and following blueprints. For those who show a strong interest in the engineering field, we also offer continuing courses that focus in more detail on the different engineering fields, coding, arduinos, CAD drawing and 3D printing.

Academy

Once a month, Roncalli has "Academy Week." The overall purpose of the Academy program is to prepare students at Roncalli for life beyond high school with lessons covering goals. planning coursework in high school, exploring potential career choices and job readiness for immediate employment. The program is a graduation requirement, with each student responsible for keeping a digital portfolio of activities and assignments as part of the process. The Academic Career Plan, or ACP, is incorporated into Roncalli's Academy Program. The ACP is a state requirement enacted in the 2017-2018 school year. Each grade level is encouraged to complete and showcase quality academic work, discover their strengths, set meaningful achievement goals, and understand the relationship between academic achievement in high school and post-secondary career and educational opportunities. The overall goal of the program is to produce responsible Roncalli High School graduates who will begin their adult life with the knowledge, skills, motivation, and a self-directed plan for career and lifelong success. Awarding of the credit will be based on participation and completion of the assignments provided. Grade-level teams will plan and execute Academy around central themes. Academy may meet in small groups, or as an entire grade, depending upon the activity planned. Outside speakers and resources will be utilized to supplement the team leaders' expertise.

RONCALLI HIGH SCHOOL BUS Information

We try to provide transportation for students who need it outside of the Two Rivers and Manitowoc city limits. We offer the following routes:

South: Bus picks up students in Sheboygan and Cleveland.

Southwest: A nine-seater bus picks students up in the Newton area (limited seating available).

West: A nine-seater bus picks students up in the Chilton and Brillion area – and anyone in between those towns and Manitowoc (limited seating available).

North: A nine-seater van picks students up in the Kewaunee area. Some Algoma students get on the bus in Kewaunee (limited seating available).

Roncalli Middle School and Roncalli Elementary School also provide transportation for students from the Mishicot and Two Rivers area while utilizing Roncalli High School buses. This shuttle service is to help transport students who use to attend St. Peter the Fisherman in Two Rivers. The bus drives the following route to transport students:

- 1. Pick up at Holy Cross church in Mishicot.
- 2. Pick up at St. Peter the Fisherman church in Two Rivers.
- 3. Pick up at Pick 'n Save in Two Rivers.
- 4. Pick up/drop off students at Roncalli High School (some parents drop off their younger students at the high school, or the younger students come to school with their older siblings, to get onto the shuttle bus that will take them to their respective schools.
- 5. Drop off at Roncalli Middle School (middle school drop off is first because the middle school starts about 15 minutes earlier than the elementary school).
- 6. Drop off at Roncalli Elementary School. wo

After school, the bus takes students back to their pick-up/drop-off locations in the following order.

- 1. Roncalli Middle School
- 2. Roncalli Elementary School
- 3. Roncalli High School
- 4. Pick 'n Save
- 5. St. Peter the Fisherman
- 6. Holy Cross
